To understand how working together can benefit your child, it is first important to understand the district's and school's goals for student academic achievement.

Hall County School System Goals:

- By the end of FY23, The percentage of students in each subgroup moving into the "Proficient" and "Distinguished" levels of performance on the Georgia Milestones Assessment will increase by 2% in the "Proficient" and Distinguished levels of performance.
- Increase the percentage of referred students who access school-based mental health services by 2% each year (with FY21 being the baseline year) to decrease the number of OSS Days in grades 6-12.

Riverbend Elementary Goals:

- By the end of FY23 school year, RES will increase by 10% the number of students reading at or above grade level in grades 1-5, as measured by Fountas & Pinnell BAS.
- By the end of FY23 school year ,90% of students master 90% of their required math facts in grades 1-5, as measured by Hall County School's Math Fluency Benchmark with a focus on the area of multiplication and division.
- By the end of FY23 school year, 90% of 5th Grade students will be able to write an organized opinion piece.
- By the end of FY23 school year, ensure that 100% of all RES students will have an adult who cares for them in the building measured by student survey data.

To help your child meet the district and school goals, the school, you, and your child will work together to:

School/Teacher Responsibilities:

- Provide weekly classroom newsletters and biweekly school-wide newsletters with information related to curriculum standards, strategies, tools and resources for parents to use with their child to help reach the established school goals
- Provide math, literacy and science workshops for parents via family engagement nights.

- Post a link to the District Parent Resource Catalog, Big Ideas on the school website that offers tips and resources for parents to support their child with math and reading skills
- School will regularly monitor student progress through a variety of assessment resources

- Try to attend the parent workshops offered by the school and, if I am unable to attend, I can request the information shared in the workshop from the school
Visit the Hall County's Big Ideas website utilizing parent resources (accessible in English and Spanish) that include instructional videos and questions to ask my child in an effort to check reading and math fluency
- Encouraging parents to volunteer at our school when applicable

As a student I will:

- Bring home our class newsletter with school announcements and specific strategies tied to each standard being taught and practice these strategies at home with my parents.
- Encourage my parents to attend the parent workshops offered by my school.
- Use the District Parent Resource Catalog website to practice and reinforce the skills needed to master the reading and math standards learned in school
